is freedom of speech really that important?

The founding fathers thought so, as this principle was incorporated as the First Amendment to the United States Constitution.

speaking out in Sky

As most of you know, I served on Town

Council for one two year term. My very first action was to place a Resolution before Council abolishing existing rules of engagement between the Town and its masters, the people.

Previously, citizens

had been limited by their servant to speaking only after an issue had been discussed, only if the mayor acknowledged them and granted permission to speak, only if the item was on Council's agenda and then only for three minutes. This seemed a bit imperial to me. Large cities like Seattle must have rules so the peoples' business can be efficiently conducted.

Sky, a small town, needs no such limiting of dialogue with constituents.

My Resolution allowed Town citizens to speak at any time without even having to raise one's hand or be acknowledged.

Citizens were requested not to interrupt others or use profane language. That was

The Resolution passed with the generous support of former Council members Sekor and Oetting. Mayor Mackner, along with Council members Goebel and Wall, expressed opposition.

During my two year tenure we did not once have to silence anyone, even though Mayor Mackner tried on many occasions.

faith that Americans, given the opportunity to govern themselves, could and would do so responsibly.

It is only when people do not understand their government or feel they no



longer have an effective voice that things begin to spin out of control.
